When Debra was diagnosed with advanced, incurable breast cancer, she felt like she was in a 'tornado' of confusion and disbelief. The care you offer through Sweet Louise has given her belonging, connection and hope.

"When I was diagnosed with advanced breast cancer in 2018, it was hard to get my head around the oncologist saying to me 'terminal' - with possibly just a few months to live. I was in a cloud of disbelief.

"For a few months I tried to keep on working, but it was impossible. It was terrible going from working full time in a good job to living on a benefit. I felt like I was in a tornado!

"But here we are – five years on. And I'm still here!

"Sweet Louise is an amazing support network. At the meetings, we often share information on treatments and side effects, and discuss strategies on how best to manage them. Sometimes we might have a moan together, but we always come away feeling uplifted. It's a place where I am understood. No judgement - just support.

"At the meetings we all share a special connection and sense of belonging.

"This helps me feel that I'm not alone.

"The Support Coordinators play a vital role in setting the environment for a fun, supportive group. They also provide valuable help and advice whenever I need it.

"The vouchers are special too. Last Christmas I used the Sweet Louise voucher to buy books. I love reading. But I worry about buying those kinds of extras because you need to budget carefully when you don't have an income.

"I wonder if the people who donate to Sweet Louise really understand the huge difference they make.

"Having Sweet Louise there to listen and to give encouragement when you need it this support is priceless."
