Exceeding our fundraising target has enabled us to invest in better, more

efficient systems and to increase the services we provide. It allowed us to invest in an additional Support Coordinator to better meet the needs of our growing membership. We recognise the additional burden our growth has placed on our frontline team – they remain the heart and soul of Sweet Louise. With more resource on our frontline team, each of our Support Coordinators can spend more of their time working and connecting directly with the women who need them most.

Together we have achieved so much. We are proud that, with your support, we have come through the Covid pandemic in a strong position to ensure Kiwis don't have to face their incurable diagnosis alone.

We will continue to adapt and evolve to ensure we have an even greater impact on those who need us. There is so much more we want to do for women with incurable breast cancer and their families. With your ongoing support, we are sure to make it possible for them to live as well as possible, for as long as possible.

We provide Family Time services for members with dependent children or grandchildren, such as family trips or treats that help create special memories for families to treasure.



Information

We support members with information and referrals to other services available through us or other providers and agencies where appropriate.




Advocacy

We advocate for improvements in treatment, services and funding for medicines for people with incurable breast cancer.










How valuable is the connection with the Support Coordinators for you?




VOUCHERS

MEMBER HOUSEHOLD INCOME*




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CURRENT MEMBERS BY REGION AS OF MARCH 2022



"Live more. Fear less!"



Hearing your doctor say, 'You have cancer' is beyond devastating. At just 38 years old, Karen received the crushing news of a cancer diagnosis.

"A year ago, my life changed," says Karen. "In the space of a week, I went from having a lump on my breast that was treatable and curable cancer - to finding out the breast cancer had spread into my liver and lymph node, therefore incurable. A terminal diagnosis.

"This is how quickly everything happened."

Thanks to you, Karen had somewhere to turn with Sweet Louise.

Karen shared: "I know that if I ever feel lost or overwhelmed, I can reach out to someone at Sweet Louise. They seem to understand me and meet me where I am at.

"I've always felt that everyone at Sweet Louise sees me for who I am — I am the person and not the cancer.

"Being diagnosed with terminal breast cancer has made me start living my best life. I can't control the cancer, but I can control how I respond," says Karen.

"I truly believe I have the attitude I do because of the people around me - from friends and family to organisations like Sweet Louise. The aroha and support have been a huge part of my journey and continue to be so.

"At the Sweet Louise meetings, it's a safe place to check in with others, but also with yourself. Sometimes life gets busy, sometimes crazy, and to have those couple of hours listening and talking with others allows me to be still for a moment and see how I'm doing. Being in a room with women who



are at different ages and stages in their own journey, it shines a light of understanding.

Perkins stood for and the reasons behind the founding of Sweet Louise gives me hope and inspiration. Sweet Louise celebrates every step. It helps me feel enabled, not disabled. It empowers me to live my best life.

"Accept the diagnosis, defy the verdict!"

Barbara McNaught from Auckland shares her story of hope - having been diagnosed with advanced breast cancer 20 years ago.

"I'm in a good place now but I never take anything for granted. Having Sweet Louise in the background has been my 'backbone'," says Barbara.

"When I originally heard of Sweet Louise I was told about the vouchers. I heard they could be used to get help around the home, I signed up that day!

"Having used the vouchers, I felt I ought to at least try attending a meeting. That was a surprise! It wasn't a group of sick, moaning women. It was instant friendship being with others who understood my 'new normal' world.

"Everyone was enjoying themselves and laughing. What a spirit lifter! I've hardly missed a meeting ever since.

"It is reassuring my Support Coordinator is only a phone call away. It has given me strength. I have some long-term Sweet Louise friends. Other friendships have been shorter, but I feel enriched and blessed to have understood and shared part of their lives.

I'll be forever grateful to Sweet Louise, the staff, the volunteers, and those who make donations that make Sweet Louise possible. I'm sure they have no idea how much they

"I enjoy working in healthcare as I love being with people," says Kendra Ellis, Sweet Louise Support Coordinator for Northland and North Auckland.

"I get so much satisfaction in being able to guide and support people when they are vulnerable or sick. You can see the positive effects of your work and know that you're making a difference.

"I think the Sweet Louise values of compassion and connection are so important to this role. I love that I get the opportunity to enjoy people and enjoy their spirit, that soul connection, and to celebrate the resilience of our members.

"It's important to get to the point where a member will feel comfortable to share their vulnerable side. Many of us present a strong, brave face when we first meet. I appreciate the opportunity to build a trusting relationship where the challenges, burdens and vulnerabilities can be shared. We get the chance to stand alongside members during the lows and the uphill struggles, as well as be with them to celebrate the joys.

"Through this role I also enjoy being an advocate for women's health. I might call an oncologist to get someone an appointment. Or I might speak out on someone's behalf to say they need an interpreter.


"Sweet Louise stands out in the breast cancer field as not simply symptom management but looking after mental and emotional wellbeing."
